



SHERLOCK HOLMES

A GAME OF SHADOWS

Sherlock Holmes was created by Sir Arthur Conan Doyle (1859–1930), a Scottish physician. Holmes was first introduced to the world in the adventure *A Study in Scarlet* and, since then, he was featured in 56 short stories and four novels.

Apparently, Holmes was based on one of the teachers at the medical school of Edinburgh University, Dr. Joseph Bell. This teacher made an impression on young Doyle due to his ability to reach logical conclusions from little evidence.

Holmes is a consulting detective who shares his professional years with Dr. Watson; they lived together until Watson got married and after his wife died.

The character of Sherlock Holmes has the Guinness World Record to the "most portrayed movie character" with over 75 actors playing the part since he first appeared on television in 1937.

The BBC created the first regular TV series in 1951.




Canada also has its own version, in this case about Holmes' great-grandniece.

Movie of the month

SHERLOCK HOLMES

A GAME OF SHADOWS



In 2009 Guy Ritchie directed his film *Sherlock Holmes*, since it was a huge success – its box office on the opening day was \$24.6 million – he decided to give it a second try in 2011, this time with *Sherlock Holmes, Game of Shadows*, not that successful now, the box office went down to \$14.6 million on its opening. They are two independent films, the plot is completely different, so, we can see the second installment without any knowledge of the first one.

This time Sherlock Holmes faces Professor Moriarty who is planning to engineer World War I some 23 years early by using anarchists to blow up French and German dignitaries in such a way as to annoy both countries.

According to the director, the movie is based on Conan Doyle's *The Final Problem* although the only similarity to it is the appearance of the villain. It is clearly not a strict adaptation to the novels, we could say that is either an independent adaptation or a reinvention of the story and the characters. Critics agree in one thing, it is not an incredibly good film but it is quite entertaining, full of humour and style. The worst thing of the film is the

And there is not doubt that the best thing is Robert Downey Jr., his performance is quite outstanding, he fakes a British accent without strangling his acting, he tries ridiculous disguises without stop being the same character and he creates a very nice duo with Jude Law.

THE OSCARS



Two years after its creation in 1927 the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences (AMPAS) decided to choose the best motion pictures of the year. Today we know this as The Academy Awards Ceremony. The first was held on May 16, 1929 at Hotel Roosevelt, Hollywood having announced the winners three months in advance, it was not until 1941 that the winners were revealed at the ceremony.

The organization is composed of almost 6,000 members who vote to choose the best performances, directors, makeup artists, original songs, scripts...being the international firm Pricewaterhouse Coopers in charge of the auditing.

The film must have been release between Jan Ist and Dec 3Ist in LA County. This is important to know because we may find a film which was released some time before but until it is not released in LA County, it is not eligible for the Oscars, for instance, Charles Chaplin's Limelight was produced in 1952, but it was not eligible for an award until 1972 because of this rule.

The minimum length of the film must be 40 minutes.







Since its creation, the ceremony has been held in different hotels and auditoriums in Los Angeles although the Kodak Theatre became its permanent home in 2002. The ceremony was first broadcasted on NBC in 1953, after that, it went to ABC in 1960 and came back to NBC in 1970. However, since 1976 it has been televised on ABC and it will continue this way at least until 2014. In Spain, the channel in charge of the ceremony is Canal+.





THE OSCARS



Since 1999, the ceremony has been held on a Sunday, and only three times in its whole history it failed to take place as scheduled:

1938: it was delayed one week due to a flood in LA.

1968: it was postponed two days because of the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

1981: it was delayed for 24 hours as there had been an assassination attempt on President Reagan.

Any good award ceremony must have a good host. There are two names that mean Oscars, Bob Hope who hosted the ceremony I8 times between I939 and I978 and Billy Crystal who has hosted it 8 times, every year there are rumours about his hosting again and this year host will be him once again. In recent years, actors such as Whoopi Goldberg, James Franco or Hugh Jackman have hosted the ceremony, some have been praised but usually this is a much criticized responsibility.





Winners of an Academy Awards go down to history of cinema and it usually means a recognition beyond imagination, job offers and a name not only in Hollywood but worldwide. All this is symbolized with a statuette, a gold plated titanium statuette on a black metal base with less that 4 kg. (34 cm-13,5"). It was designed by Cedric Gibbons and sculpted by George Stanley. The model for the statue was the Mexican director Emilio Fernandez. As for the name Oscar, there are a lot of theories about the origin; it was only in 1932 that Walt Disney quoted the Oscar is his acceptance speech, and not until 1939 that the name was officially used by the Academy. The statuette belongs to the Academy, not to the winners, it cannot be sold if not to the Academy and the price is just that of \$1.

THE OSCARS Oh my Oscar! Facts

- •Walt Disney hold 22 awards and 4 honorary awards.
- Composers John Williams has 47 nominations.
- •The oldest person getting an Oscar was Jessica Tandy at the age of 81 for *Driving Miss Daisy*.
- The youngest person with an award is Tatum O'Neal, 10, for Paper Moon.
- •The first black performer to attend the ceremony and win was Hattie McDaniel for *Gone with the Wind*, she had to seat in a segregated part of the auditorium.
- •In 1942 Irving Berlin presented the Award for best song and he won it himself.
- •Only 3 movies have got the 5 top awards, Best Film, Best Director, Best Actor, Best Actress and Best Screenplay. They are: *It happened one Night, One Flew over the Cuckoo's Nest* and *The Silence of the Lambs*.
- •Lord of the Rings: Return of the King (2003), Titanic (1997) and Ben-Hur (1959) have the Record in number of awards won in one ceremony.
- •Meryl Streep has the record in number of nominations, 15 and two wins.
- Turning Point (1977) and The Color Purple (1985) had II nominations but not even one win.
- •Kathryn Bigelow was the first woman to be awarded as best director in 2009 for *Hurt Locker*.
- •Marlon Brando didn't accept his Oscar for *The Godfather* in 1972 because of the mistreatment of Native Americans.



The number of categories has changed throughout the years; at he beginning there were only 15 categories and today we count 25, for example, Best Foreign Film category was not added until 1957. Some categories were added and others retired, for instance, best dance director or Academy Juvenile Award among others.

Valentine's Day



Valentine's Day is celebrated on the 14th of February all around the world, however, the origin of this festivity is quite unknown and there are different theories about this. One of the most popular legends tells that Valentine was a Roman priest in the third century under Emperor Claudius II, who ambitioned more and more lands. For the emperor the best warriors were those who did not have a home to come back, that is those who were not married, hence, he made marriage illegal for young men. Valentine did not approve of this at all and he went on marrying people in secret. Unfortunately, this did not last for long and, when the emperor found out about it, he imprisoned Valentine. Claudius ordered that he be put to death. While he was in jail he fell in love with the jailor's daughter who visited him quite often and he wrote a note to her that read "Love, from your Valentine". It is believed that he was executed on the 14th of February, 270AD.

Today, Valentine's Day is celebrated in a lot of countries and has been this way for centuries now. *The Parlement of Fouls*, by Geoffrey Chaucer, is the first reference to the concept of St. Valentine's Day as a special day for lovers. This was written in the 14th century.

People usually exchange cards and gifts such as flowers or chocolates.

According to the Greeting Card Association, an estimated one billion Valentine cards are sent each year, making Valentine's Day the second largest card-sending holiday of the year, after Christmas, of course.

The first time I landed on Asia was in China, Shanghai. My first impression was chaotic, crowds, fakes of everything and people who only wanted to work twenty four hours a day and sell everything they make! For twenty four hours a day!

One year after that, the night before I was catching my plane to Japanese lands, images of geishas, temples and the most and last fashionable electronic gadgets came to my mind while I was packing. Just as you mention "Japan" and it evokes a cascade of old temples, futurist cities, mountains wrapped in clouds and trains which run at the speed of light! And this is true! So my second time in Asia was going to be the discovery of a very different culture, awesome people and definitely the knowledge of the modern and traditional synthesis, one of the reasons why to travel to Japan is a fascinating experience.





TRAVELLING CORNER Tokyo Diaries 1.0

Tokyo is Japan's capital and the country's largest city. Only a few cities can stimulate our imagination on such a contradictory way as Tokyo does. Skyscrapers rows and neon lights flash to the rhythm of advertising billboards in Shinjuku streets, office workers wearing dark suits walk through Ginza together with impeccably dressed women who have lunch carrying Prada and Louis Vuitton handbags, train wagons fill up with people who crowd on rush hours......while temples and sanctuaries give the smell of incense off and Aikido, a martial art, is practised to bring body and mind into line with everything in the universe. Tokyo is also one of Japan's 47 prefectures, but is called a metropolis (to) rather than a prefecture (ken). The metropolis of Tokyo consists of 23 city wards (ku), 26 cities, 5 towns and 8 villages.



Prior to 1868, Tokyo was known as Edo (literally "bay-entrance"), because of its situation next to the mouth of the "Sumida-gawa" river. As a small castle town in the 16th century, Edo became Japan's political centre in 1603 when Tokugawa levasu established his feudal government there. A few decades later Edo had grown into one of the world's most populous cities. With the Meiji Restoration of 1868, the emperor and capital were moved from Kyoto to Edo, which was renamed Tokyo ("Eastern Capital"). Large parts of Tokyo were destroyed in the Great Kanto Earthquake of 1923 and in the air raids of 1945



TRAVELLING CORNER Tokyo Diaries 1.0



Tokyo is a city that was razed to the ground twice in the 20th century, once by earthquake and once by wartime bombing raids. On each occasion Tokyo has risen from the ashes, but little of true historical value survives. Despite this, Tokyo still has the power to make you go 'Wow!'

The sense that nothing here is permanent has produced a city that renews itself at an unimaginable speed. From the futuristic new cityscapes of Odaiba or Roppongi Hills to the bustling shopping and entertainment centres of Shibuya and Shinjuku, all are fully functioning areas where the first time visitor runs the risk of neck-ache from craning up to see the neon signs or the summit of a skyscraper.



Tokyo Tower

Everyday I crossed the Tokyo Bay and I could see the Tokyo Tower before reaching the bridge. It was built in 1958; Tokyo Tower soars 333 meters, 13 meters higher than the Eiffel Tower. There are two observatories from which to get panoramic views of Tokyo, and Mount Fuji on a clear day. The Main Observatory is 150 meters high, the Special Observatory, 250 meters high. The tower is lit by 164 floodlights: orange in winter and incandescent white in summer.



COOKING CORNER

Chocolate-Chip & Nuts Cookie s

Ingredients

230 g margarine

 $230 \mathrm{~g}$ (1 cup) softened butter

 $2~{
m cups}$ packed brown sugar

2 cups sugar

 $4 \, \mathrm{eggs}$

4 teaspoons vanilla extract

2 teaspoons baking soda

2 teaspoons salt

6 cups flour

4 cups of chocolate chunks

1 cup (add-in chopped pecans or walnuts)



Preheat oven to 190°C.

Combine flour, baking soda and salt in a small bowl.

Beat butter, granulated sugar, brown sugar and vanilla extract in large mixer bowl until creamy.

Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition.

Gradually, beat in flour mixture.

Fold in chocolate chunks and add-in..., amounts can vary depending on how "chunky" you prefer it.

Drop by rounded tablespoon onto ungreased baking sheets.

Bake from 9 to 12 minutes or until golden brown. Allow to cool for 2 minutes before removing from baking sheet.

This is a double batch, makes for dozen. They don't last long!
