Movie of the month

Tianic

There are some big names in directing and, undoubtedly, James Cameron is one of them. Back in 1995 he started the production of what would become the most expensive movie in history, only to be surpassed by Cameron himself with *Avatar*. The movie was released on December 19th 1996 and has been again released, this time in 3D, to commemorate the 100 years of the tragedy.

Although some critics predicted a huge failure due to the high cost, that was not even close to reality, not only was *Titanic* a profitable film, but also it got 14 Oscar nominations and won 11 of those.

The main plot is the love story between a Third Class boy and a First Class girl. However, this is not the most important thing in the film. *Titanic* was a revolution in terms of technology, Cameron has an outstanding technology applied to movies background (*Terminator 2, Abyss*). He wanted the movie to make history and he sure did. The production team tried to show the real tragedy and they had a bunch of resources for that. Although the main characters were completely fictional, some actual passengers were portrayed on the film.



Realism was a key part of the project and Cameron decided to start the film with real footage of the ship and the beginning of the voyage as well as real footage of the shipwrecked under the sea. They even created a miniature of the ship in Baja California. Also, an indispensable part of the film was the music and that is why the director chose Celine Dion for the soundtrack, which was a good decision and the Oscars proved him right. For some of us, that can be the best of the film, for others, the love story or the sinking itself, whatever part, this movie will always be part of cinema history.





Movie of the month



On 10th April 1912, the second of the three Olympic-class ocean liners (the others were the RMS Olympic and the HMHS Britannic) set off from Southampton, England. It had taken three years and \$7,500,000 to build the Titanic. This ship was famous at the time because of its size, capacity and luxury; however, the reason why she went down on history was the tragedy that took place 4 days after. She made two port calls, one in France and another in Ireland, and was bound to New York.

The ship was prepared for three types of passengers. She accommodated 337 in First Class, 285 in Second Class and 721 in Third Class, as well as 885 crew members. A total number of 2228. Actually, she could have accommodated many more people, as many as 3339 people, including the crew. Luckily, there had been a coal strike some days before and a lot of cancellations had been made. The facilities found in the ship met the most luxurious hotels; first class passengers could enjoy a library, a barber shop, gymnasium, swimming pool, squash court, electric bath and a Verandah Café. Of course, Third class passengers did not have the same advantages; nevertheless, they had better conditions in the Titanic than in any other ship at that time. They slept in cabins for a maximum of ten people; there was only one bathroom for men and one bathroom for women. The classes were completely segregated, thus, a Third Class passenger was not allowed to any First Class area. The difference in class was clear in the use of materials, the Third Class toilets were made of iron, those in Second Class of porcelain and those in First Class were marble.







Movie of the month



On 14th April 1912, four days into the crossing, Titanic struck an iceberg at around 23.40; it took about three hours for the ship to sink entirely. It has been said that the captain had been warned about the danger of the area because of the ice, yet, he continued the voyage without changing the direction. Titanic carried only 20 lifeboats, that is, for 1,178 people. Back then, regulations in terms of maritime safety were not the same as today and the White Star Line actually provided more lifeboat accommodation than was legally required. For the evacuation they followed to "women and children first" protocol, sadly, quite a big number of Third Class women and children died and an important number of First Class men survived. The sinking of Titanic caused 1,514 deaths. By the time another ship, Carpathia, arrived, they only found 710 people, the survivors of the sinking; this number should have been higher but some of the lifeboats were only half-full.

One of the legacies of the tragedy of Titanic was the establishment in 1914 of the International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea.

Titanic's owner J. P. Morgan was scheduled to travel on the maiden voyage, but cancelled at the last minute.

A number of expeditions were mounted to find Titanic but it was not until 1st September 1985 that a Franco-American expedition succeeded.

• Only 328 bodies were recovered from the wreck.

The Seven Wonders of the Ancient World

In the 3rd Century, several historians wrote about the most important and spectacular monuments of their time. They considered these incredible buildings should be visited because they really were engineering and precious art works. All of them were situated in the territory of Alexander The Great's Empire, thus, the list is completely reduced to the Hellenistic world.

Great Pyramid of Keops (Khufu)

This pyramid is the biggest of the three that are still in Giza, Egypt. It was the highest building until the 14th Century, when the Lincoln Cathedral was built. It was the tomb of the Emperor of Keops and it was raised in the 26th Century b. c.

The pyramid was coated with white stone and the peak was decorated with gold. It should be very impressive to see that construction shining with the sun. Herodotus was there and visited the inside of the pyramid in 450 b.c. The Egyptian priests told him how the pyramid was built: the carved stones were lifted with machines that were made of small timbers.





Gardens of Babylon

They were built in the 6th Century b. c., under the kingdom of Nebuchadnezzar II, king of the Chaldeans. Again, Herodotus wrote about this wonder that was in the Euphates riverside, but it couldn't be visited by common people.

Nebuchadnezzar II was married to Amyitis, daughter of the king of the Medes, to create an alliance between the two nations. The queen missed the landscapes and the mountains of her country, so the king decided to recreate her birthplace building a complex with artificial mountains with hanging gardens. The gardens shouldn't handle literally. They should overhang like a terrace.

Mausoleum at Halicarnassus

This was a huge tomb made of white marble. The queen Artemisia, wife and sister of the king Mausolo, ordered to build the tomb when the king died. In the 12th century the Mausoleum was still up, but an earthquake left only the base and in the next century it was finally destroyed by the Crusaders.

The tomb had 117 ionic columns and a sculpture of a quadriga with the portrait of the king and the queen. There were also more than 400 sculptures made by the most important sculptors of that time. Nowadays, some of those sculptures are in the British Museum.





Temple of Artemis

The temple was built in the city of Ephesus, in modern Turkey. The place where it was erected was an ancient site of cult to the goddess Cybeles; that is why the statue of Artemis that was in the temple, had a crown with a tower. This sculpture was made of wood and coated with silver and gold. This goddess represented fertility and she was able to give or take lives. For appeasing her angry, the king of Lidia decided to build this temple in the 6th century b. c. The building works took 120 years, and several architects worked there.

The temple suffered a fire in 356 b. c. It is said that the fire started when Alexander the Great was born. It was reconstructed in 4th century b. c. but the Goths destroyed it in the 3rd century a. c.

Lighthouse in Alexandria

This tower was built in the 3rd century b. c. in the island of Pharos, in Alexandria, Egypt. About 115 meters high, it was the highest building for several centuries. A replica exists in China.

The lighthouse had a block of glass in the squared base to prevent the erosion of the sea. The rest of the construction was made of marble assembled with molten lead. During the day, a big metallic mirror reflected the sunlight and, in the night, there was a big bonfire that could be seen from 50 kilometers.

In the 14th century it was destroyed by an earthquake.



Statue of Zeus in Olympia

This chryselephantine statue (made of gold and ivory) was executed by Fidias in the 5th century b. c. It was inside the temple of Zeus in Olympia, Greece.

The sculpture had 12 meters high and it was sitting in a throne with the naked bust, a cloak around his legs and a crown made of olive leaves. In his right hand, he had a small Nike and in the left one, he held a scepter with an eagle.

Nowadays, we can see this sculpture in some commemorative coins



Colossus of Rhodes

It was a huge statue of Helios, the god of sun. It was made in the 3rd century b. c. and it was destroyed by an earthquake in III a. c.

It was made of iron and coated with bronze, and it had 32 meters high. In the 7th century a. c. the Turkish stole the bronze that was in the sea.

MEMORIAL BAY



Memorial Day, formerly known as **Decoration Day,** is an American holiday celebrated on the last Monday of May. It started after the American Civil War inspired by people from the South and how they honoured their dead. The essence of Memorial Day is to commemorate and pay tribute to those who fought and died in the Civil War. However, since the beginning of the 20th century it has extended to all those fallen in wars for their country.



Memorial Day is celebrated at Arlington National Cemetery, Virginia, each year with a ceremony in which a small American flag is placed on each grave. The flag of the USA flies at half mast from dawn until noon. A lot of remembrance moments take place during the day but the most important one takes place at 2 pm. There are also thousand of parades throughout the country featuring marching bands and National Guard and veterans participating. In addition, Americans can enjoy the National Memorial Day concert on the west lawn of the United States Capitol or on TV through PBS and NPR and via American Forces Network to those who are overseas, stationed at bases in 175 countries as well as 140 U.S. Navy ships at sea.





MENGBEL BAY



This is one of the few federal holidays in the United States; hence, most people do not go to work. A lot of people use this three-day weekend to visit family of friends or to take a short holiday. Nowadays, Memorial Day is also related to the beginning of the summer season and people tend to gather for picnics and especially for barbecues.

Memorial Day and Sports



Indianapolis 500

It is an annually 200-lap automobile race held at the Memorial weekend since 1911. It takes place at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway in Speedway, Indiana.

Coca-Cola 600

It is the longest NASCAR Sprint Cup, 600 miles (more than 950 km). It has been held the same day as the Indy 500 since 1961, although the chances are that in the future it will be held the night before due to economical reasons.



Memorial Tournament

It is a PGA Tour golf tournament founded by Jack Nicklaus and carried out at Muirfield Village Golf Club in Dublin Ohio. It has been held on or close to the Memorial Day weekend since 1976. The most characteristic feature of the tournament is the ceremony honouring past golfers, installing a plaque for the honorees near the clubhouse.

COOKING CORNER

Thai cuisine Pad Thai With Shrimps

Ingredients for 2/3 people, preparation time: 30 minutes.

1/2 packet Thai rice noodles

3 tablespoons of vegetable oil

1 egg

2 cups of bean sprouts

2 chives

some boiled shrimps or prawns

1 tablespoon of fish sauce

3 cloves chopped garlic

1/2 teaspoon of ground dried chili

pepper

ground pepper

1 lime

2 tablespoons of toasted and crushed

peanuts

2 tablespoons of chopped turnip

1 chopped shallot

2 tablespoons of sugar

2 tablespoons of tamarind paste

1/3 cup of julienne pressed Tofu

1/2 quartered banana leaves (optional)

Thai cuisine is characterized by balance and strong flavours, especially lime juice, lemon grass and fresh coriander, the combination of which gives Thai food its distinctive taste.

PAD THAI is one of the most popular street foods in Bangkok. There are different kinds of this dish, but this is the most traditionally and commonly found, which is made with dried shrimp.

Preparing the Ingredients

- 1. Soak noodles in lukewarm water for 15 minutes while preparing the rest. When it is ready it should be flexible but not soft.
- 2. Grind the peanuts, and toast them in a pan until lightly brown, about 3 minutes on low heat.
- 3. Chop garlic, shallot and turnip, and cut the chives, leaving some for garnish.
- 4. Cut the banana leaves lengthwise and rub the cut immediately with lime juice to prevent it from turning dark.


Pad Thai With Shrimps

- 5. Heat up a wok or a large pan, and add the oil to the wok.
- 6. Drop the chopped shallots and garlic in. Stir for half a minute, then drop tofu and turnip in. Let the tofu brown, about 1 minute.
- 7. Add the drained noodles and ground dried chili pepper. Stir them.
- 8. When the noodles are ready, add the seasonings: ground chili pepper, fish sauce, sugar and tamarind. Stir to mix them well.
- 9. Add dried shrimps. Stir for a minute. Taste to see if you need more seasoning. Remember that the noodles should have strong flavour because they will be diluted by egg, bean sprouts and chives at the end.

The Final Touch

10. When the noodles are cooked and chewy with desired seasonings, push the noodles aside to make room for the egg. Drop the egg in. Scramble the egg into the noodles. When the egg is cooked, add half of the bean sprouts (save the other half for garnish) and chives. Stir quickly to preserve the crunchiness of bean sprouts and green color of the chives. Pour the pad Thai Into a serving plate.
