Learn well and have a great summer





Country of contrasts: tradition and innovation




Japan is a very big country. Although everybody thinks it is just a few islands, these islands have nearly $400.000 \,\mathrm{km^2}$ – Spain has about $500.000 \,\mathrm{km^2}$ – and, more than 127 million people live there. The country has four big islands and a lot of very small ones. We went to the biggest, named Honshu, with almost 100 million people. The most populated cities are Tokyo and Yokohama but there are also bigger cities: Kyoto, Nagoya, Osaka...


Tokyo, the capital of the country, has more than 10 million people. It is a business city. There are people everywhere, at all times. If you take the subway during rush hour, you can see people with their faces pushing the wagon's windows; ushers jostling people to help them enter the subway, and watching people because it is frequent to commit suicide throwing themselves to the tracks.

In the city you can find whatever you want. If you like technology, games, geeks... your district is Akihabara. In there, there are exclusive shops that sell consoles, manga, figurines, everything related to electronics, girls with pitched voices inviting you to the meido's coffees...

In Ginza and Shibuya there fashion shops. One are Zara's Building, another one Louis Vuitton's... Women dressed like models, men with suits... And people and people around. In these smells of districts the air consumerism. And, of course, we were part of this. I bought a pretty and simple belt.

A very peculiar thing Tokyo is the smell. There is a constant smell of food. Spain there are bars everywhere; in Japan, the happens with same and they restaurants, are cheap. You can have lunch for 5 euros (soup, rice, a main course and water or tea).

There isn't dessert, but you can buy a lot of different sweets and cakes in the metro stations or in the seven elevens and most of these cakes have very few calories.

In contrast with this mega city, you can visit Kyoto. Although it seems small, more than 1 million people live there, but when you are walking you feel as if you were in a village. Except in the centre of the city where there are small houses with window boxes in the entrance hall, old women walking, people wearing traditional costumes. You can feel the peace all around you. Everywhere you see the mountains that surround the city, with maples and bamboo trees.

People are different too. In Tokyo, people look like stressed, in a hurry. In Kyoto there is no hurry. People asked us if we needed help. In fact, a woman accompanied us to a temple by bus, though she had to get off the bus at a different stop. She was really kind, and we were lucky because she spoke English.

There are many temples in Kyoto, with incredible gardens. All around is green: trees, bushes, flowers, and moss without grass... The contact with nature is very close, and you don't need to go far away to find these calm places. And it is easy to watch a religious ritual between the visits to the temples and gardens.

Movie of the month



In 1997 the producers of what will become a franchise created a sci-fi comedy based on a comic book series by Lowell Cunningham published by Marvel Comics. One of these producers was, of course, Steven Spielberg, aka Hollywood's King Midas. The started with a budget of \$90m and earned almost \$600m.

The franchise focuses on a secret organization, *MIB*, *Men in Black* who cleans the messes made by aliens in our planet. Agent K (Tommy Lee Jones) recruits Agent J (Will Smith) for that purpose.

Although the first installment was highly praised by the critics, the second one (2002) not so much, in my opinion because it was not a new thing anymore. The comedy continues in the second installment paying some more attention to supporting characters such as Frank, the talking dog or the worms, both of whom we miss in the "threequel".



This third installment, released in Spain on 25th May, has already earned a worldwide total of \$579,253,796. In spite of the figures, there are mix feelings towards the film. Some say it is better than the previous one but not as good as expected. There is a gap in time of 15 years between this one and the opening of the franchise and of course a lot of things have changed especially visual effects. The movie is lucky to have two masters of that craft as *Men in Black 3*s dual Visual Effects Supervisors, Ken Ralston and Jay Redd.



Movie of the month




The gist of *Men in Black 3*, in brief, is that Agent J bewilderingly loses all traces of the saltier Agent K and must perilously time-jump back to the Warhol, flower power and moon launch of super-groovy 1969 to save Young Agent K. Apparently the whole idea of time travelling was Will Smith's back when *MIB2* was made.

There has always been an incredible chemistry between Tommy Lee Jones and Will Smith and there was a risk of that changing with Josh Brolin (young Jones), however, their chemistry was as good. As a matter of fact, Brolin's performance is one of the best things of the movie although they want to make us think that he is 29 when in real life he is 44.

Another change in the franchise is that Will Smith is not in charge of the soundtrack as in the second installment, in *MIB 3*, Pitbull remakes an old song to create "*Back in Time*".

So, if you liked Men in Black 1 and 2 you should not miss this one, you will have 88 of fun, action and visual effects.









INDEPENDERCE DAY


History



What we know today as United Stated of America was once under the government of the British Empire. However, in 1775, people in New England started fighting for their independence. On 2nd July 1776, the Congress secretly voted for independence from Great Britain and the Declaration of Independence, which is nowadays on display in the National Archives and Records Administration in Washington, D.C., was written explaining the justification for separating from the British Crown. John Hancock, President of the Continental Congress at the time, was the first to sign it on 4th July, 1776 although the remaining 54 delegated would sing it later on 2nd August, 1776. The document was publicly read on 8th July and a celebration took place in Williamsburg on 25th July. In spite of the celebrations, the term *Independence Day* was not used until 1791. In 1870, Independence Day was made an unpaid holiday for federal employees. In 1941, it became a paid holiday for them. Today, Independence Day is a federal holiday celebrated all over the country.

Interestingly, Thomas Jefferson and John Adams, both signers of the Declaration of Independence and presidents of the United States, died on July 4, 1826 - exactly 50 years after the adoption of the declaration.





INDEPENDER DAY

Celebrations



Independence Day is a very special celebration and it is understood as a family holiday. Quite a lot of people use one or more of their vacation days to create a long weekend to escape to the beach or the mountain. Independence Day consists on celebrating all the positive things of the United States as well as celebrating the American tradition. Some of the typical activities on this day include watermelon or hotdog eating competitions and sporting events, such as baseball games, three-legged races... A lot of people have picnics on Independence Day and there are some typical American things that you should try that day, for example, hamburgers, corn on the cob, apple pie and cranberry juice.



There is a great display of American symbols such as the US flag and the Statue of Liberty. Many communities also arrange fireworks and people usually gather to see them. There are also different public events as parades, for instance. Tourists, and non-tourists, who are in USA on this day can visit some colonial attractions such as the USS John F. Kennedy in Boston, it often sails into the harbor while the Boston Pops Orchestra holds a concert on the banks of Charles River featuring American music. Another example of this is Philadelphia, which holds its celebrations at Independence Hall, where historic scenes are reenacted and the Declaration of Independence is read.

COOKING CORNER

Cherry pie

Ingredients

5 cups fresh sweet, dark cherries, rinsed and pitted, or frozen pitted cherries 3 tablespoons lemon juice

1 1/2 cups fresh blueberries, rinsed and drained, or frozen blueberries


1 cup sugar

1/4 cup cornstarch

Falg pastry

2 teaspoons butter or margarine, cut into small pieces

Vanilla ice cream (optional)



- 2. Spoon cherry mixture over 3/4 of the pastry in pan, leaving 1 quadrant free. Spoon blueberry mixture into unfilled area. Scatter butter evenly over fruit.
- 3. Top filling with stars and stripes as directed for flag pastry. Set pie in a foil-lined 13- by 17-inch baking pan.
 - 4. Bake on the bottom rack of a 400° regular or convection oven until fruit is bubbling in the center and pastry is well browned, about 1 hour. If pastry edges brown too quickly (check after 40 minutes), cover loosely with foil.
 - 5. Let pie cool on a rack at least 3 hours; let stand at room temperature up to 8 hours. Cut into wedges and serve with ice cream, if desired.

Note: If using fresh cherries, buy about 1 3/4 pound; if using frozen, you'll need about 1 1/2 packages, 16 ounces each.
